## A Few Words From Our Pastor.....

My Dear Parishioners, Brothers and Sisters,

On Ash Wednesday we received ashes in the form of a cross. This ritual dramatizes the purpose of these forty days, which is to unite ourselves with Jesus in his Passion, Death and Resurrection. The question is: *How does a person make a good Lent? What will I do differently during these six weeks?*

The three basic Lenten "tasks" are: *prayer, fasting and almsgiving*. Sometimes people think that these practices are too old for us, that Jesus has somehow spiritualized everything. You know, it's the 21st century – we don't have to get on our knees, or reach into our wallets or pass up a tempting dessert. Jesus did not say, *"If you fast."* He said, *"When you fast."* He did not say, *"If you feel like praying."* He said, *"When you pray."* Nor did he say, *"Give if you happen to have something extra."* No, he said, *"When you give alms."*

That last penitential practice – *almsgiving* – is what Pope Francis focuses on in his message. I'd like to remind you that the theme of the Pope's letter this year is **"The Word is a gift. Other persons are a gift."**

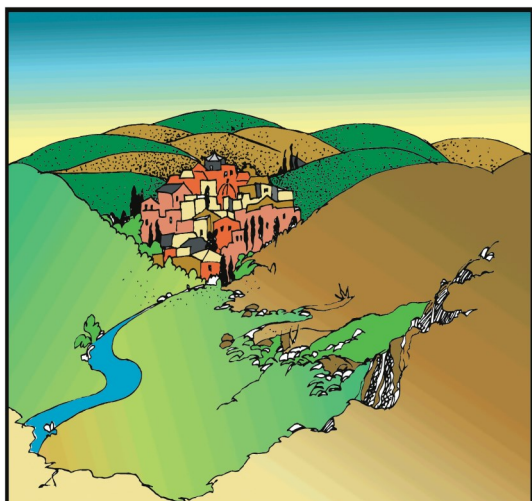
The Pope points out that giving alms not only helps the person who receives. More importantly, it helps the person who gives. Using the parable of the rich man and Lazarus (cf. Lk 16:19-31), Francis wrote: "Lazarus teaches us that other persons are a gift. A right relationship with people consists in gratefully recognizing their value. Even the poor person at the door of the rich is not a nuisance, but a summons to conversion and to change. The parable first invites us to open the doors of our heart to others because each person is a gift, whether it is our neighbor or an anonymous pauper. Lent is a favorable season for opening the doors to all those in need and recognizing in them the face of Christ. Each of us meets people like this every day. Each life that we encounter is a gift deserving acceptance, respect and love. The word of God helps us to open our eyes to welcome and love life, especially when it is weak and vulnerable. But in order to do this, we have to take seriously what the Gospel tells us about the rich man."

We will have wonderful opportunities for almsgiving during Lent. Beyond support of the parish and the diocese, we do what we can to reach out to the poor in our world. A good way of doing this is by taking home a Rice Bowl. The Rice Bowl will remind us of the three tasks: fasting, prayer and almsgiving. I know that sometimes people feel stretched. That's all right. We need to recognize the source of all we have. Christ became poor for our sake. Almsgiving unites us with his self-giving.

I invite you to make a good Lent: to do some voluntary fasting, to find new moments for prayer and – in response to the message of the Holy Father – to help the needy and yourself by giving alms.

I wish you all a wonderful Sunday rest. I remember you in my everyday prayers and I ask: pray for me too, please. May God reward you all the good that you do for Sacred Heart Parish.

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### STRENGTH AGAINST TEMPTATION

The first Sunday of the season of Lent always includes a Gospel account of the temptation of the Lord Jesus in the desert by the devil. This year, the story is set against the backdrop of the first reading from Genesis, which recounts the very first temptation by the devil. That story is set in a garden of delight. The Gospel story is set in the desert. As believers, we know that temptation comes our way in our own gardens of delight as well as the deserts of our lives. As Lent begins, our attention is drawn to that temptation within each of us to become like God—we want control, power, and answers to all of life’s difficult questions. As communities of faith, we are given this season of repentance so that we can join our hearts with others on the difficult journey of conversion. We look to God and to one another for strength against temptation.

### TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

In recent years, there has been a resurgence of interest in various forms of adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. Some people suggest that this recovers an ancient tradition in the church, when in fact the practice belongs to a later time. The custom of showing the consecrated host to the people, encased in a vessel called a monstrance, developed in a period of history when even very pious people received Communion only rarely. The opportunity to see the host raised high above the head of the priest at Mass, or to see the host exposed outside of Mass, was thought by many to be a form of spiritual Communion. Without question, our Catholic practice of reserving the consecrated host both for adoration and Communion of the sick and dying is a cherished tradition.

Over the next few weeks, we’ll look at how these traditions developed and how the Church envisions reservation and adoration today. We do this by the light of the liturgical reforms that have restored a heightened appreciation for how receiving the Body and Blood of Christ is central to our worship. “Perpetual Adoration,” “Reservation,” “Benediction,” and “Reposition” are all part of the Catholic vocabulary. Often the terms are misused, and a tangled history—as well as widely varying practices in our parishes—adds to the confusion. Many Catholics today have never participated in Benediction, or even spent time in adoration on Holy Thursday night. There’s plenty of interesting history, much of it surprising and challenging, and we will do our best to inform you along the way.

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Our faith calls us to stand in solidarity with all. We hear this call in the Gospel of Matthew, when Jesus proclaims, "Whatever you did for one of these least brothers or sisters of mine, you did for me" (Matt 25:40). We hear it in the words of Pope Francis, who invites us to build a culture of encounter: "We are called to reach out to those who find themselves living at the margins of our societies and to show particular solidarity with the most vulnerable of our brothers and sisters: the poor, the disabled, the unborn and the sick, migrants and refugees, the elderly and the young who lack employment."

In the spirit of contributing to such a culture here in the Archdiocese of Chicago, I encourage you to participate in the Catholic Relief Services (CRS) Rice Bowl program during this upcoming Lenten season. Drodzy Bracia i Siostry,

Nasza wiara wzywa nas do bycia w solidarności ze wszystkimi. Słyszymy to wezwanie w Ewangelii św. Mateusza, kiedy Jezus głosi, „Wszystko, co uczyniliście jednemu z tych braci moich najmniejszych, Mnieście uczynili" (Mt 25,40). Słyszymy to również w słowach papieża Franciszka, który zaprasza nas do budowania kultury więzi braterskiej: „Jesteśmy powołani, aby dotrzeć do tych, którzy sami znaleźli się na granicy marginesu społecznego, dlatego też powinniśmy wykazać szczególną solidarność z naszymi braćmi i siostrami: najuboższymi, niepełnosprawnymi, nienarodzonymi dziećmi i chorymi, migrantami i uchodźcami, starszymi i młodymi, którzy poszukują pracy.”

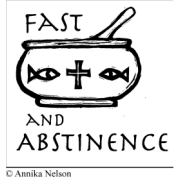

# LENTEN REGULATIONS



Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years old and older on Ash Wednesday and on all the Fridays of Lent. Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. Those who are bound by this may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted. The special Paschal fast, as well as abstinence, are prescribed for Good Friday and encouraged for Holy Saturday.

Wstrzemięźliwość od potraw mięsnych musi być przestrzegana przez wszystkich Katolików, którzy ukończyli 14 rok życia, w Środę Popielcową oraz we wszystkie piątki w okresie Wielkiego Postu. W Środę Popielcową wszyscy Katolicy, którzy ukończyli 18 rok życia a nie przekroczyli 59 lat, zobowiązani są do zachowania Postu. Osoby które mieszczą się w tych granicach wiekowych mogą sporzyć jeden posiłek. Dwa mniejsze posiłki dozwolone są w przypadku gdy są one konieczne do utrzymania się danej osoby na siłach, ale jedzenie pomiędzy posiłkami nie jest dozwolone. Paschalny Post jak również wstrzemięźliwość od pokarmów mięsnych obowiązuje w Wielki Piątek i zachęca się do ich przestrzegania również w Wielką Sobotę.

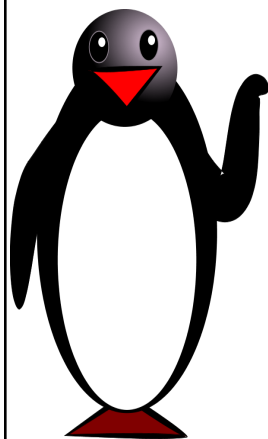
